COLONIAL NAVAL RESERVE.

The formation of a colonial naval reserve in Newfoundland has proved very successful in the initial experi-ment. Last November 57 fishermen from 18 to 22 years ofd, were selected. from 18 to 22 years ofd, were selected, and went in the cruiser Charybdis for a six months' voyage in the West Indies. These men have returned home, and speak so highly of the experience that it is said to be certain that hundreds will follow them next year. The scheme of service involves six months' daily on a war ship, then a month's duty each year for five years, either on a ship or in a battery. After that another five year term can be taken, with increased pay and guarantee of pension. From the start each man gets food, clothing, bedding and 26 cents per day. In Ontario it is more fully ecospilzed than in this province that the waters which attract anglers are a good asset and a source of wealth to be preserved and developed. They not only protect but increase the value of their preserves. As an instance, note the following from the Mail and Empire:

The Ontarie government and the Grand Trunk railway, working emplointly, have now successfully placed three carloads of parent black bass in Lake Rosseau, Joseph, and Muskoka, the fish being apposited in perfect condition at twenty-five points in each lake. The work is being pushed as rapidly as possible, as these are spring-spawning fish, and it is destruct to get the lakes stocked before the spawning season begins.

In view of the progress of the work of restocking the lakes, the government is considering the advisability of reducing the number of fish that may be caught by each angler in these lakes. At present the limit is welve per angler per day, but under the circumstances it is felt that four or five per angler per day would not be anneasonable.
