

PRESBYTERIAN MINISTER QUOTES THE BIBLE TO SHOW WAR WILL END JAN. 27, 1918

Two Interesting Sets of Figures and Deductions
Having to Do With the Kaiser and "The Beast"
—Quotations from Apocalypse.

This war will end January 27, 1918. This date is set in the Bible according to a certain Presbyterian minister near Ottawa, who believed that St. John predicted present day history in Revelations, and determined to find the meaning of the mysterious numbers and prophecies found in the 13th chapter of that book of the Bible which has remained more or less of a conundrum through all the centuries of theological study.

The divine makes his point from the 18th verse, which reads: "Here is wisdom. Let him that hath understanding count the number of the beast, for it is the number of a man and his number is six hundred three score and six."

The minister, according to an alphabetic code numbering the letters from one to twenty-six, shows that Kaiser spelled, with their corresponding figures instead of letters is 11-13-19-3-18. Adding six to each of these numbers you have 116-19-25-25-24, which added together makes 205 the number given in the quotation as the number of the man.

Basis of Prophecy.
In the fifth verse of the same chapter he points out that you read: "And there was given unto him a mouth speaking great things and blasphemies."

les; and power was given unto him to continue forty and two months." So the minister figures as the war opened July 27, 1914, in adding forty-two months it brings you to Jan. 27, 1918. He sees further substantiation for this approximate date in Rev. 12, where it is said: "And the woman fled into the wilderness where she hath a place prepared of God that they should feed her there a thousand, two hundred and three."

Figuring it Out.
Dividing 1200, or the number of days given, by 365 days, one finds that in years her period in the wilderness is three years and 165 days, or approximately three years and one-half.

In further support of this date he quotes the 14th verse of chapter 12: "And to the woman were given two wings of a great eagle, that she might fly into the wilderness, into her place, where she is nourished for a time, and times, and half a time from the face of the serpent."

Of the same one, Daniel in his book chapter 7:25 says: "And he shall speak great words against the most High, and shall wear out the saints of the most high and think to change times and laws: and they shall be given into his hand until a time and times and the dividing of time."

Here is Another.
Louis Fisher writes to the Amherst News:

"There are no doubt many theological students numbered amongst your readers whose interest in the wonderful book of Revelations will be quickened upon reading the article and to them, and also to those who doubt, I would ask careful consideration of the following deductions. Remember, the number of the beast is the number of a man, this number is 666. This is what St. John saw. 'I stood upon the sand of the sea, and saw a beast rise up out of the sea, having seven heads and ten horns, and upon his horns ten crowns, and upon his heads the name of blasphemy.' Treat this description in the same manner as the minister treated Kaiser omitting the plus 6 and you will find 22 E 5 A 1 S 19 T 20 and you get 47 'Sea' similarly treated gives 25 'Seven Heads, ten horns, ten crowns, gives 341 'Blasphemy' gives 101 'Hohenzollern' (the Kaiser's dynasty) 152 and you get the number of the man 666 Seven heads, ten horns, ten crowns are twenty-seven emblems of the distinguishing features and there are twenty-seven states in Germany! Blasphemy is the Kaiser's middle name. Again, treated alphabetically Wilhelm gives 83 Germany 83 Hohenzollern 152 Seven heads, ten horns, ten crowns gives 341 Add 6 for the 'eighth king' Chapter XVII.

Again, let us remember that the war began July 28, 1914, when Austria declared war on Serbia, and on July 27, 1914, the Kaiser had lived 666 months. A remarkable chain of coincidences which should provide an interesting theme of discussion in some of the pulpits of our cities in town.
