### Horseback Ride of 800 Miles. (McClure's Magazine.)

The most wonderful straight away ride ever made by a man was the gallop of Francis Xavier Aubrey-ci-devan; Canafrancis Xavier Audrey—cr-devan; Canadian voyageur, and a famous pony express rider—from Santa Fe (N. M.), to Independence (Mo.), in 1853—800 miles in Ave days, 13 hours.

In 1852 he had covered the same istance in a little over eight days, and his record was on the wager of \$1,000 that he "could do it in an even eight."

In the whole distance he did not stop to rest and changed horses only with every 112 or 200 miles. He was a stocky French Condan, light hearted, genial, adventur-




