" The capture of one of these veffels had before " been notified by the Ambaffador of his Catholic " Majesty by order of his Court, who at the fame " time defired that measures might be taken for pre-" venting his Majefty's fubjects from frequenting " thole coafts, which were alledged to have been " previoufly occupied and frequented by the fubjects " of Spain. Complaints were also made of the " fisheries carried on by his Majesty's subjects, in " the feas adjoining to the Spanish continent, as being " contrary to the rights of the crown of Spain. In " confequence of this line of communication, a de-" mand was immediately made, by his Majefty's " order, for adequate fatisfaction, and for reflitution " of the veffels previous to any other discussion.

"By the answer from the Court of Spain, it ap-" pears, that these vessels and their crews had been " fet at liberty by the Viceroy of Mexico, but this is "represented to have been done by him, on the " supposition that nothing but the ignorance of the " rights of Spain had encouraged the individuals of " other nations to come to those coasts for the pur-" pole of making establishments for carrying on " trade, and in conformity to his previous inftruc-" tions requefting him to fhew all poffible regard to " the British nation. No fatisfaction was made or " offered, and a direct claim was afferted by the "Court of Spain to the exclusive rights of fove-" reignty, navigation, and commerce, in the terri-" tories and coafts in that part of the world and " feas.
