Supervisor, are bound according to the said Act, and also on condition of keeping a record of all his operations, returns of which shall be made monthly to the Supervisor; and any Culler so hired and engaged, offend- 5
ing against the provisions of the said Act or of this Act, shall, on being duly convicted thereof before any Court having competent jurisdiction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding *one hundred pounds* currency, or 10
be imprisoned for a term not exceeding six calendar months, in the discretion of the Court, for each such offence; and any person not duly licenced as a Culler, who shall cull, sort, measure, mark or stamp any article 15
of Lumber, the same being shipped, or intended to be shipped for exportation by sea by or upon such culling, sorting, measuring, marking or stamping, or who shall do or perform, in respect of any such article of Lum- 20
ber, any other act or thing constituting an essential part or portion of the operation of culling, sorting or measuring Lumber, with intent to evade or elude the provisions of the aforesaid Act or of this Act, shall, on being 25
duly convicted thereof in a summary manner before any Justice of the Peace of the District in which the offence shall be committed or the party so offending shall be found, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding *twenty* 30
pounds, and not less than *five pounds*, or be imprisoned in the common gaol for a term not exceeding two calendar months, at the discretion of the said Justice, for each such offence; and any culling, sorting or separat- 35
ing any article of Lumber into particular dimensions, descriptions or qualities, or any mark, score, letter, figure or sign made with chalk or otherwise, or in any other manner or way whatsoever in or upon any such arti- 40
cle of Lumber, shall be deemed and taken to be a culling, sorting, measuring, marking or stamping, as the case may be, within the intent and meaning of this section; and proof of such Lumber having been placed alongside 45
or taken on board of any sea-going ship or
