The York University Theatre Department presents Luigi Pirandello's *Six Characters in Search of an Author* from

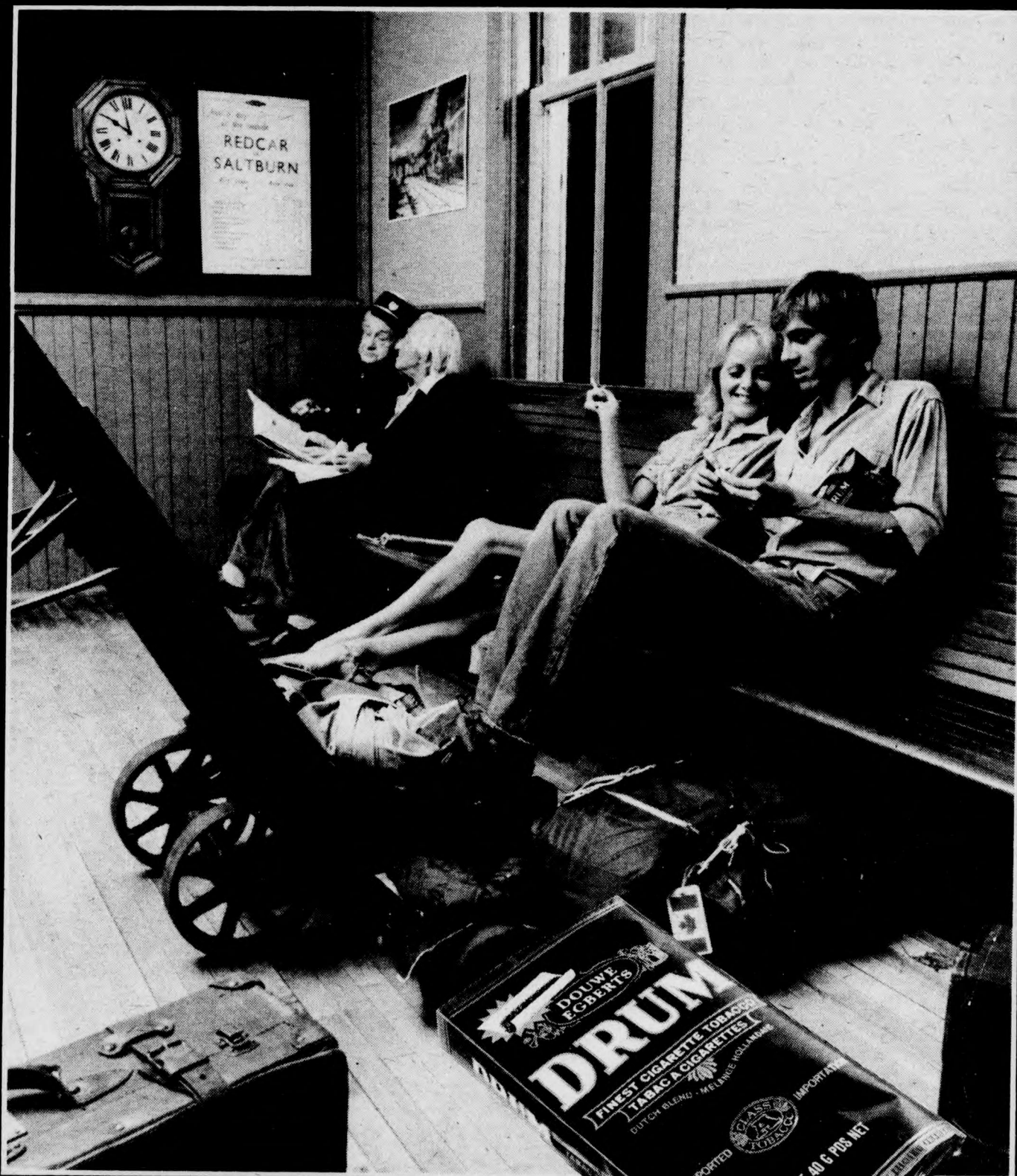
