# Community new president a surprise

Caroll didn't even know there was a ratepayers' association in the area when he first moved in, about a year ago

But in the short time he's lived in the community he's already noticed some prominent community problems, especially the heavy traffic on Benedet Drive and Truscott Drive

He fears that the new Clearview community in Oakville, just west of Winston Churchill Boulevard will aggravate those existing problems even more.

Another key issue in the association is the pursuit of legal action against the city of Mississauga and region of Peel as a result of flooded basements last year on Lewisham Drive and Wiseman Court.

The lawyer representing the homeowners told the association at the annual meeting that two new reports prepared by consultants for Mississauga and Peel strengthen the citizens' case. The reports show that sanitary and storm sewers were interconnected throughout Park Royal, apparently with the knowledge of the city's plumbing inspectors.
