to carry on fishing, cannot be entertained "unless the "Indians assent to their " participating in the " fisheries in the vicinity " thereof." Obligation that might have been implied in such negotiations, or anything expressed in the Treaties effected, it is unnecessary to repeat the ample assurance already given in the Thursters letter of the 19 " January last! The indians werywhere have been allowed full liberty to fish around their reserves, to supply all reasonable wants; and not only have they enjoyed the same freedown as white fishermen, with and without exclusive titles,
