Camp Borden, Ont.	17-3-41		and Sq. Ldr. Bradshaw RAF Padre from Port Albert read the Committal Service in the Chapel at Barrie Union Cemetery. Firing party, escort and pall bearers supplied by No. 1 S.F.T.S. G/C C. Mackworth, Sq. Ldr. Gething & Flt. Lt. Snetzinger attended from No. 1 Training Command, Sq. Ldr. Mathers, 6 officers and 12 airmen from No. 31 A. N. S. At 1800 hours "Wings Parade," Course 16 J.A.T.P. in Drill Hall. Sq. Ldr. Bradshaw R.C.A.F. presented "wings" to 29 RAAF pupils and 15 RCAF. Two others earned their wings who were not on the parade, one in hospital, and had his "Wings" pinned on immediately after, the other was grounded at Mt. Hope, and will be given his wings on his arrival back at the Station. High winds, cold snow.
