Ottawa, 2nd. November, 1914.

Sir:-

I beg to inform you that the following telegram was sent Mr. Blewett, Indian Agent, at Kamsack, on the 31st.
ultimo regarding three bulls at his agency, viz:-

"Reference yours thirtieth September. Bulls should "be beefed and used for destitute rations instead of being "sold at such a low price."

Ine foregoing telegram was sent as the result of Mr. Blewett's statement that the animals should be sold or transferred to another agency as they had been too long in service and also in consequence of your report of the zoun October. With reference to the last paragraph of your letter of the 26th October, I beg to say that in future the Department desires that when you visit an agency you will inquire with regard to the number of bulls upon each reserve, and ascertain how long each of the said animals has been on the reserve, and if you think it desirable that a change should be made you should make recommendation to that effect.
