Re:- Trapping Grounds Interior Indians.

As promised during our conversation of yesterday I beg to submit a letter written to sergt bryce of the R.C.M.P. who it was understood had powers to help settle Trapgrounds of the intorior for the Indians of No Dames and Lierd. (also Pelly Banks Indians should they come down again.)

Chief Tonmy Cigar's application for his two brothers is being drawn out and it is expected that many more will come along on

the next Mail from Mc Dames.

This motter was delt with in a letter to your Office dated Aug. 26 th 1930, and was also contained in the Registered Trap Line Dats. File that was loaned and read over by yourself July 27 th. 1931.

As we both understand, the settlement of these Nomads on specially relected grounds, is no small effeir, and will take some time, as there ere about 200 odd lines to arrange.

Failing a Come warden in this huge district, perhaps the Came Authorities have asked Sergt Bryce to do what is possible, but as you see, this office has requested him to give what attenfon he can, to the matter, when the Indians appear at the Posts, which in most cases is only once a year.

Every effort is being made to get these Nemads Registered, as

soon as ever it is possible.
