Telegraph Creek, B.C.

Sir,

Re:- Trapping Grounds Interior Indians.

As promised during our conversation of yesterday I beg to submit a letter written to Sergt Bryce of the R.C.M.P. who it was understood had powers to help settle trapgrounds of the interior for the Indians of Mc Dames and Liard. (also Pelly Banks Indians should they come down again.)

Chief Tommy Cigar's application for his two brothers is being drawn out and it is expected that many more will come along on the next Mail from Mc Dames.

This matter was dealt with in a letter to your Office dated Aug. 26 th 1930, and was also contained in the Registered Trap Line Data File that was loaned and read over by yourself July 27 th. 1931.

As we both understand, the settlement of these Nomads on specially selected grounds, is no small affair, and will take some time, as there are about 200 odd lines to arrange.

Failing a Game warden in this huge district, perhaps the Game Authorities have asked Sergt Bryce to do what is possible, but as you see, this Office has requested him to give what attention he can, to the matter, when the Indians appear at the Posts, which in most cases is only once a year.

Every effort is being made to get these Nomads Registered, as soon as ever it is possible.
