SLIAMMON TRIBE NEW WESTMINSTER AGENCY.

I did not have the opportunity to visit the reserves of the Sliammon tribe but I seen the Chief and some of their members, who called on me here.

Re application No.21, of the Sliammon tribe, for fourteen acres for one Indian Dominic Tom, and which the Commission Mecided was not available, I respectfully recommend that the fourteen acres applied for, and which is aleged by the applicants to have been cleared, by them, be subtracted from Lot No.1475, and be credited to the applicant tribe for Dominic Tom, for the reason that it was cleared by the applicants, and if it is not given to the Indians they will always be under the impression that a mis-carrage of justice has been dealt to them and they will never understand why, something which they owned was taken from them, and which was improved by their labors.

Fishing, hunting and foreshore rights, together with other matters for this tribe will be dealt with, in the future together with the other tribes in British Columbia.
