

other than Copal, Carriage, Shellac, Mastic or Japan; Vegetables, not elsewhere specified; Vehicles of Travellers, except those of Hawkers and Pedlars; Water Lime, unground; Wine, spirits and fermented Liquors of all kinds, imported for Officers' Mess, and the packages containing the same; Wood for hoops when not notched; Woods of all kinds; Wool; All importations for the use of Her Majesty's Army and Navy serving in Canada, or for the public uses of the Province.

*Table of Prohibitions.*

The following articles are prohibited to be imported under a penalty of fifty pounds, together with the forfeiture of the parcel or package of Goods in which the same may be found:—Books, drawings, paintings and prints of an immoral or indecent character; Coin, base or counterfeit.
