A valuable "Wagner" collection in Vienna, is now offered for sale for £22,000. It includes thousands of documents, portraits busts and manuscripts.

A committee has been formed to raise funds for the erection of a monument to Abbé Franz Liszt at Weimar, where he rendered such distinguished and enduring services to the art of music.

Lully, the celebrated French composer (1633–87) directly met his death from a too-vigorous beating of time to his orchestra. In January, 1687, he was conducting a Te Deum in honour of the King's recovery from a serious illness. He had provided himself with a stout stick some six fert in length, and with this he gave loud knocks on the floor to mark the time. Unfortunately in a burst of enthusiasm he struck his foot instead of the floor. An abcess followed—the quack in whose hands he placed himself proved incompetent and Lully died within two months.
