out of the public Money in the Treasury, to Mr. John Kent, Messenger and Door-keeper of this House, for his Services to this Day inclusive.

Voted, That the Sum of Twenty Pounds three Shillings and feven Pence be paid by the Treasurer of the Province, out of the Public Money in the Treasury, to Mr. Robert Fletcher, for Printing the Votes and Journals of this House, and Stationary supplied.

Resolved, That Mr. Speaker do in the Name of this House (when his Excellency is in the Chair) acquaint His Excellency, that as the Season of the Year is very severe, and it is very difficult to make a Quorum of the House, many Members being at a great Distance, and others fick, the House find it impracticable to proceed upon the important Confideration of the State of the Province Funds this Session, and therefore pray His Excellency will be pleased to grant them a Recess.

A Message came from his Excellency the Governor, requiring the Attendance of the House in Message from His the Council-Chamber, accordingly Mr. Speaker with the House went up to attend His Excellency, who was pleafed to give his Affent to the following Bills, viz.
