A Bill to authorise and regulate the assessing, collecting and levying, of the County and District Rates, and for the Appropriation and Expenditure of the same, and to repeal certain Laws relating to the said Rates, was read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Deblois, *resolved*, that a Select Committee be appointed to prepare and bring in a Bill for the relief of Public Debtors to the Province, by giving further time of payment.

Ordered, That Mr. Wilkins, Mr. Bliss, Mr. Deblois, Mr. Johnston and Mr. Young, be a Committee for the above purpose.

Petition for Road
near Shelburne

A Petition of Thomas Jones and others, was presented by Mr. C. Roche, and read, praying aid towards making a road from the head of Long Island, near Shelburne, through their Settlement, on the Roseway River; and thereupon,

Mr. C. Roche moved that the Petition be referred to a Select Committee, to examine and report upon to the House, which being seconded and put, and the House dividing thereon, there appeared for the motion, eleven; against it, eighteen.

So it passed in the Negative.

Bills to continue
Alien Act

Mr. Uniacke reported from the Committee on the Expiring Laws, and thereupon presented to the House several Bills, viz:—

A Bill to continue the Act respecting Aliens coming into this Province, [or residing therein.

Halifax Watch Act

A Bill to continue the Act for the better preservation of the Property of the Inhabitants of the Town of Halifax, by providing for a sufficient Watch at Night.

Town Officers Act

A Bill to continue the Act in further addition to, and in amendment of, the Act for the choice of Town Officers and regulating of Townships, and the Act to alter and amend the same.

Trespass Act

A Bill to continue the Acts now in force relating to Trespasses.

Summary Trials Act

A Bill to continue the Act for the Summary Trial of Actions and the Act in amendment thereof.

Bridewell and Police
Act

A Bill to continue the several Acts concerning the Bridewell and Police in Halifax.

A Bill to continue the Act, entitled, An Act in further addition to the Act relating to Wills, Legacies and Executors, and for the Settlement and Distribution of the Estates of Intestates.

A Bill to continue an Act in amendment of certain Acts relating to Wills, Legacies and Executors, and for the Settlement and Distribution of the Estates of Intestates.

Road expenditure
regulation Act

A Bill to continue the Act to regulate the Expenditure of Monies hereafter to be appropriated for the service of Roads and Bridges, and the Act in amendment thereof.

Inferior Court Act

A Bill to continue the Act concerning the Inferior Courts of Common Pleas within this Province.
