Mather Byles Almon, Esquire, was introduced, and presented his Mandamus—the same Mr. Almontakes was read—whereupon the usual State Oaths were administered to him by Mr. Stewart, one oaths of the Commissioners, and he, having subscribed the same, after giving and receiving salutations to and from the Members present, his seat was assigned him next to Mr. Clarke.

Mr. Stewart, by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor's command, informed the Message from H. E. House, that during the recess, Mr. Johnston, (the Attorney General,) and Mr. Smith and nation of Members Mr. Wilkins, had requested leave to resign their seats in this House, and that Her Majesty had been pleased to accept their resignations.

Mr. Stewart presented the Petition of William Weeks, praying aid to run a Packet be- Pet. of Wm. Wocks tween the Bay of Verte and Prince Edward's Island-which was ordered to lie on the Table.

Edward Kenny, Esquire, was introduced, and having presented his Mandamus, the same Mr. Kenny takes was read-whereupon Mr. Kenny took the oath appointed to be taken by the Act of the oaths tenth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, by persons professing the Roman Catholic Religion; and, after giving and receiving salutations to and from the Members present, his seat was assigned him next to Mr. Almon.

On motion made and seconded—the House adjourned until to-morrow, at 3 o'clock.
