Resolved that the sum of £100 be granted to the Overseer's of the Poor of the Parish of Fredericton, to reimburse in part the extraordinary expences in curred in the support of disbanded Soldiers, and the Widows and Families of deceased Soldiers.

The sum of £25 to E. Tilton, in consequence of her application by Petition,

and in discharge of all future application.

Resolved that the sum of £60:3:4 be granted to His Honor the Presi-DENT, to defray expences incurred relating to the Sloop Brunswicker, per account.

Resolved that the sum of £50 be granted to His Honor the PRESIDENT, to be applied in such manner as His Honor may think proper, towards the relief of the Family of Ebenezar Dibble, who suffered losses, as stated in his petition, in performing services as the Carrier of the Mails between Fredericton and Westmoreland.

Resolved that the sum of £100 be granted to His Honor the President, towards defraying the expence of revising and reprinting the Acts of the General Assembly, passed since the year 1805, and of framing and printing an Index thereto; to form a second volume to the Acts republished to that year inclusive.

Which report is ordered to be received.
