A Question of Order was raised as to whether the motion in amendment of the Honorable Mr. Sanborn, already decided by this House, is or is not substantially the same as the motion in amendment now under discussion.

The Honorable the Speaker decided in the affirmative, and therefore ruled the said

motion in amendment out of order.

And the Debate on the motion of the Honorable Sir E. P. Taché proceeded.

When the Honorable Mr. Reesor moved in amendment, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Bureau.

That the following words be added to the main motion:

"Provided, always, that His Excellency the Governor General be prayed to withhold the transmission of the said Address until the said Resolutions shall have been approved of by the electors of this Province, qualified to vote under the Act 22 Vict., Cap. 6, to be signified by a direct vote on the said Resolution, to be taken in the various Municipalities throughout Upper and Lower Canada."

On a Question of Order being raised as to whether the said motion can be entertained, because in substance it has been disposed of with reference to the decision upon the

Honorable Mr. Currie's motion of amendment,

After a short Debate,

The Honorable the Speaker ruled the said motion to be in Order.

Whereupon the Debate on the said motion in amendment proceeded.
