Toronto, July 26.-The following

Toronto, July 26.—The following statement was issued yesterday from the Parliament Buildings:

"The execution by the Government has been completed of the guarantee of principal and interest of debenture stock of the Canadian Northern Ontaria stock of the Canadian Northern Ontsric Railway Co. (formerly the James Bay Railway Co.), at a rate not exceeding \$20,000 per mile of the company's line between Toronto and Sudbury, a dis-tance of 268 miles, the total amount of the guarantee being \$3,360,000. This debenture stock is payable on July 10 1936, and bears interest at the rate of 31-2 per cent. per annum. The company's line is almost completed between the company's line is almost completed between the company's line is almost completed. pany's line is almost completed be-tween Toronto and Parry Sound, and 70 per cent. of the grading on the balance has been completed, in addition to bridge work, etc. The guarantee was given under the authority of chapter 20, Ontario Statutes, 1904.

How Money Will Be Paid.

"One of the sections of the act provides that the purchasers of the se curities shall pay the money directle into a bank approved of by the Gov ernment, to a special account in the name of the Treasurer of the Province. The Treasurer has the authority to pay out the money from time to time to the Railway Co., on the certificate of a Government engineer, due regard be-ing had to the work done and materials or equipment provided, and to that remaining to be done or provided.
