A Public Meeting will be held at the

Bay Verte Hall on Friday, the 23rd

March, instant, at 1 o'clock, p.m., for the

purpose of presenting the New Brunswick

Government with a sum of money for a Rail-

road from Au Lac, through the Parishes

of Westmorland and Botsford, to Cape

Tormentine, the point where the Wind-
