GOVERNMENT LOST ON A DIVISION

Australian Federal House of Representatives Was Defeated by Thirty Six.

CURE FOR SEA SICKNESS

LONDON, Tuesday.—A Melbourne cable says the Federal House of Representatives met today and on a division the Government was defeated by 49 to 13. The House adjourned until Thursday.

The Canadian Associated Press is informed that Victor Grayson, the Socialist M. P., is making arrangements to tour Canada. Grayson, having been expelled from the Commons,

is prohibited from sitting in the House at the present session, but can sit in the next house.

THIRTY ANIMALS BURNED IN ZOO.

LONDON, Tuesday.—By a fire which occurred in the Zoological Park, South part, about thirty animals, including two elephants, were asphyxiated or burned to death. Nothing remains on the site of the building in which the animals were confined but a number of charred upright poles and a smoldering mass of cinders.

The gardens are visited by a quarter of a million people each season, and the Zoo was one of the principle attractions.

The flames were first observed by a policeman at a little after one o'clock in the morning, and within half an hour, and before the arrival of the firemen the entire wooden structure which was covered with fetid and had recently been tarred, was destroyed. The flames, fanned by the brisk northwest wind, spread very rapidly and when policemen and keepers arrived it was found impossible to rescue the animals.

The valuable collection destroyed comprised: Two elephants, bison, seals, dromedary, camel, llama, tapir, nyctanantelope, two Shetland ponies, two Nubian goats, two emus, two rheas cossowary, three ralic deer, fastidied sheep, black-headed sheep, axis deer, two black bucks, number of birds.

The female elephant was a splendid Indian specimen, standing 8 feet 6 inches high, and the male elephant, 7 feet smaller, was a trained animal. Apparently the latter had broken loose from its tether at the commencement of the fire, for its partly burned carcass was found lying several feet away from its stall. In his charred condition, their tusks fell away to dust on being touched. The bison was stated to be the only perfect specimen in England. A crane and two eagles were the only creatures to escape, and these were subsequently recaptured.

Though a policeman was the first to observe the fire, the first intimation of the outbreak was given by a little terrier belonging to Mr. Clifton Riding, manager of the Richmond Hotel situated within the gardens. He was awakened about one o'clock by his dog snuffing up and down the stairs barking, as if he was alarmed, but he paid no attention to it or the loud trumpeting of the imprisoned elephants in their terror until he was called up by the policeman.

Mr. Nathan Yates, the proprietor of the gardens, estimates the total damage at 2,500 pounds, which is partly covered by insurance.

Happily, the other portion of the Zoo, which contained the lions and tigers, was a quarter of a mile distant from the scene of the fire, and quite escaped.
