SWEDEN'S PRINCE. LEADS GRAND DUCHESS MARIE

TO RUSSIAN ALTAR. Great Pomp and Ceremony Characteristic of Stateliest Court in Europe-Cannons Thunder Out Paean While Solemn Te Deum is Chanted.

St. Petersburg, May 3.-Prince Wilhelm of Sweden, second son of King Gustave, the popular sailor prince who visited America in 1907, was mar-ried this afternoon to Grand Duchess Marie Paylovna, a cousin of the Emperor of Russia and daughter of Grand Duke Paul Alexandrovitch. The ceremony took place at the Tsarskoe Selo, and was accompanied by all the pomp and brilliant display of color characteristic of the most stately

court in Europe.

To-night a great state banquet was served, at which toasts were drunk to the good understanding between Sweden and Russia recently reached in the Baltie agreement to which today's wedding, the first in modern times between the ruing houses of the two countries, puts the seal.

The robing of the bride was performed according to court custom, in the private apartments of the Empress. Sine was dressed by the Empress and the Dowager Empress, assisted by their maids of honor and ladies-in-waiting.

A salute of twenty-one guns and a blare of trumpets announced the start of the procession. At the head came the Dowager Empress, on the arm of King Gustave; the Emperor of Russia escorting Queen Olga of Greece, the Empress escorted by the Grand Duke of Hesse, Crown Prince Ferdinand and Crown Princes Marie of Roumania, attended by the court ushers and mar-
