



**The Evening Chit-Chat**

"Will you kindly tell a girl who has never been entertained very much until recently, and who does not wish to display her ignorance by asking her friends, something about the etiquette of dining in a cafe?"

Of course, I will gladly tell her anything that I know about, and as the two specific questions that she propounds are very simple, I guess they come under that heading.

The first is, "In a party of two or more at a cafe or other public place, does each one give the waiter his order, or does the one who has invited the party order for all?"

Usually the person who has invited the party gives the order for all, after having consulted his guests as to their preferences.

Her second question is, "In ordering where dinner is served in courses, do you order one course at a time, or all at once?"

There is no hard and fast rule about that. Most persons order oysters and soup and perhaps the fish course, and then decide on the latter courses while these are being brought.

I don't often talk on the subject of etiquette, so while I'm on this topic I am going to make bold to offer one or two little etiquette reminders that may not come amiss.

"When is it etiquette for a man to take a woman's arm?" I heard asked the other day.

Never.  
A man should never take a woman's arm. He should offer her his.

And it is not etiquette for him to do this in the daytime unless the woman be old or infirm. At night he may offer her his arm, although even then it is quite as good taste not to. As for the habit of perpetually guiding women about by the elbow, which so many men have, I think it is abominable, and any woman is justified in resenting it.

A good many men, I have noticed, step back and allow the woman to leave the car before them. That is very bad form. A man should always get out of the car first and then offer his hand to help his companion out.

That a man should not smoke when walking with a woman on the street is a rule that I suppose most men know, even if, knowing the right, they still occasionally pursue the wrong.

But there is one rule of smoking etiquette that it seems to me cannot be fully understood, it is so generally disregarded, and that is the rule that it is extremely impolite for a man to talk to a woman with a cigar, pipe or cigarette in his mouth.

I stood in front of the finest hotel in this city the other day, and saw a man dressed in the extreme of fashion—tall silk hat and clothes of the very latest cut—hand a fine lady into a very magnificently appointed automobile, with a very gracious and lordly manner, and then climb in and sit beside her, chatting with her, while a cigar tilted from the corner of his mouth.

I fancy that man would have hooted at the bare idea of his needing any hints on etiquette. And yet—

If all these little reminders are entirely unnecessary, please just forget them.

**HOUSEHOLD NOTES.**

A delicious salad dressing is made by combining mayonnaise to the boiled dressing, equal parts of each being used.

Brittle finger nails indicate a lack of oil: eat more olive oil and butter, and rub vaseline every night on the nails.

A good mixture to set color in cotton materials is one tablespoonful of turpentine, a handful of salt and a pail of cold water.

When glossy colored straw hats look dusty and off-color, brush them over with a solution of varnish of equal parts of shellac and alcohol.

When next cooking figs to use for dessert, add half a lemon and a small stick of cinnamon. The change in flavor will be found very tasty.

When hats have become grayish and shabby, they can be brightened by rubbing over them a flannel sprinkled with a few drops of kerosene.

If the enamel inside a rusty teakettle is not cracked, it may be thoroughly cleaned by putting in soda and cold water and bringing to boil.

When serving any of the rich cheeses like Brie Gorgonzola, or Rochefort, many hostesses now pass cream, cheese or some milder cheese with it.

Five cents worth of tartar emetic mixed with an equal amount of sugar, moistened and put in small dishes, where the ants are will drive them away.

Shrink and set color of children's garments before making up. They soil so easily that it is not worth while to run risks by waiting until afterwards.

Have you tried cheeseballs rolled in egg and bread crumbs and fried in boiled fat? They are delicious when served with lettuce hearts and Virginia ham.

Put a little borax in the water in which you will wash table covers, doilies, towels, etc., having red borders, as the borax keeps the red clear and bright.

The secret of boiling rice is to put the rice into water that is boiling, and to use an abundance of water. Then the result will be each grain standing separate.

Fur coats should be packed on their hangers; it is a mistake to put them back in their boxes. Don't use a
