# State Loans to Traders.

An arrangement designed to remove the inconvenience to trade caused by the break-down of the foreign exchanges was announced recently by Mr. Lloyd George as a result of a series of conferences with traders and bankers. In the absence of the usual exchange facilities it has been impossible to export or import goods

in any appreciable quantity. Under Mr. Lloyd George's scheme the Bank of England will provide acceptors with the funds necessary to pay all approved pre-moratorium hills at maturity. This will release the drawers and endorsers from their liabilities as parties to the bills, but their liability under any agreement with the acceptors for payment or

cover will be retained. The acceptors will be under obligation to collect from their clients all the funds due to them and to apply vances. Interest will be charged at 2 per cent, above Bank rate. The Bank of England undertakes not to claim repayment of amounts not re-
