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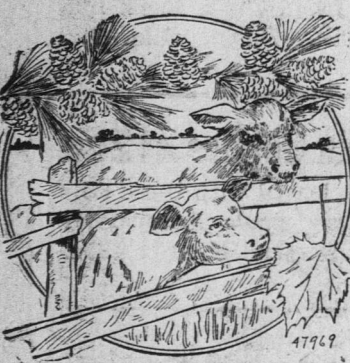

More Larcenies Committed.

Felix O'Connell, who was arrested

From The Sagona.

The Reid Nfld. Co. received a mar-
conigram from Capt. Parsons, of the
Sagona, last night, saying that the
ship had arrived at Black Tickle at
noon yesterday. Capt. Parsons sent
the message via Grady and Fogo and
it is presumed that the Sagona is on
the way South though the message
does not state so. The ship encoun-
tered N.E. and S.E. winds with sleet
and rain during the trip but yesterday
the weather was fine with a light
south west wind. Very little frost
was experienced.

No Tidings of Missing Craft.

There is still no tidings of the mis-
sing schooners Blanche M. Rose and
Swallow, the former bound here from
Gros Isles, and the latter from
Fogo to Bay Roberts. The Cabot and
Ingraham, which are engaged scour-
ing the north and south shores, re-
spectively, in search of the missing
crafts, had not reported up to noon
to-day and it is assumed were not
successful in their mission up to that
hour.

London Doctors Suspects

That Bombs from Zeppelins are Im-
pregnated with Germs of one of the
Deadliest Varieties Known, Causing
Fatal Gangrene.

London, Nov. 19.—The high rate of
mortality among persons injured by
bombs thrown from Zeppelins at first
caused the belief that these bombs
contained poisons. Now, according
to the Daily Mail, surgeons suspect
that the bombs are impregnated with
disease germs.

The Daily Mail quotes an unnamed
surgeon at a hospital where 40 per-
sons seriously injured in the last raid
were treated, as saying that the death
rate was at least five times as high as
would be expected among patients
wounded equally severely in battle or
accidentally.

"In practically all the cases," the
surgeon continued, "a germ causing
rapidly fatal gangrene which is very
rarely met with in ordinary hospital
practice has been discovered by the
hospital bacteriologists. Patients who
have received the best treatment af-
forded by a modern hospital within
ten minutes after being injured have
suffered a much higher death rate
than soldiers who after receiving
wounds of the same severity, have
had to wait 24 hours before being
treated.

Enquiries are being made to deter-
mine whether Italian bacteriologists
have found the same germs in the
wounds of those injured in the recent
raids on Verona. If this rare gan-
grene-causing germ is found there also
it will be pretty strong evidence
that the bombs were deliberately im-
pregnated with one of the deadliest
varieties of disease germs known.

Life Saving Scouts.

The 3rd St. John's Troop Boy
Scouts held a most interesting meet-
ing in their room last night. Major
Cave spoke to the large gathering in
his usual pleasing and interesting
manner. The main object of the
meeting was to reorganise the Troop
to Life-Saving Scouts, which are run
on exactly the same principle as the
B. P. Scouts, only having their head-
quarters at Toronto, Canada. Many
important questions were asked by
the members about the movement, and
all were soon convinced that the Life
Saving and B. P. Scouts are run on
the same basis. A new branch was
also established in connection with
the Troop under the name The Young
Cubs, consisting of boys from eight to
eleven. The new division will be
commanded by E. Nicholle and H. G.
Hussey. This new branch promises
to be a credit to the Troop and all are
determined to win the favor of their
supporters. The Troop was dismiss-
ed after singing the National Anthem.

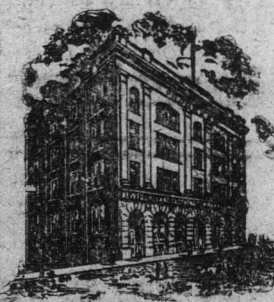
