Probably the earliest reference in literature to chess was that by the Persian poet Firdusi, who, in his historical poem, "Shahmama," mentions the introduction of the game into Persia.

It is worth recalling that the first ecok Caxton printed in England was translation of a treatise on the game written about 1300 by Jacobus de Ces selia, a preaching friar.

Scott is said to have objected learning chess because the time learning chess because the time it would occupy would be sufficient to learn two languages. On the other hand, Henry Thomas Buckle was one of the finest players of his day. John Huss, when in prison, deplored having played at chess "whereby he had lost time and run the risk of being subject to violent passions." subject to violent passions."

Napoleon's Curious Set.

It is a curious circumstance that nost great generals were poor chessplayers. Marshal Saxe was an exception: and Napoleon relieved the tedium of life on St. Helena by playing with a quaintly-carved set. One king was fashioned in his own image and the other represented Frederick the Great, the other pieces showing the respective uniforms of the two

In regard to the part chess has played in history, one must dismiss as a myth the romance that Charlemagne lost his knigdom over a game of chess to Guerin de Montglave; and equally doubtful is the story that a certain Prince Otkar of Bavaria was killed by blow on the temple by Pippin, who, so the story runs, had been ignominiously checkmated.

It is easy to believe, however, that the fiery William the Conqueror, when beaten by the Prince of France, "knocked the chess-board about his the prince's) head," and that the incident "was the cause afterwards of much enmity between them.'

There are many evidences that Canute was an enthusiast. Carlyle, in his "Early Kings of Norway," relates that a dispute arose between Canute and Earl Ulf when at chess, that the earl upset the board, and was murdered shortly afterwards by Canute's orders. The "Ramsey Chronicle" records that Canute, visited on State matters by Bishop Utheric, was found at ches

In mediaeval days chess came der the ban of puritanical prelates. In France fines were imposed for indulgence in the game; and in Spain the edict went forth that "Clerks playing at dice or chess shall be excommunicated." A bishop ordered to do penance for being a chess-lover in 1061 was reproved by Cardinal St. Peter Damian in these words: "Was it right say, and consistent with thy duty to sport away thy evenings amidst the vanity of chess, and defile the hand which offers up the body of the Lord and the tongue that mediates between God and man with the pollution of a sacrilegious game?" 


