Yet do we see your kings and rulers lavishing their treasures more freely on means for the destruction of the human race than on that which would conduce to the happiness of mankind. These strifes and this bloodshed and discord must cease, and all men be as one kindred and one family .. .. Yet not a man glory in this, that he loves his country; let him rather glory in this, that he loves his kind."


