Paris, Sept. 25 .- The Politique Colniale publishes a dispatch from St. Petersburg today, saying that, as a result of an exchange of views between. 4,080,680 2,029,210 2,638,215 the chancellories of St. Petersburg, Paris, Berlin, Vienna, Rome and Con-stantinople, the Sultan of Turkey will shortly address the powers on the subject of Great Britain's evacuation of Egypt, and that Russia, supporting the sultan, will invite a conference at Constantinople or St. Petersburg, with the object of settling the question on the pasis of the autonomy of Egypt, under the suzerainty of the sultan.

WITH PISTOLS

Duel Between Premier Badeni of Aus-

tria and an Opposition Leader. Vienna, Sept. 25.-A pistol duel was fought this morning between Count Badeni the Austrian premier, and Dr. Wolff the German Nationalist leader. arising from insults addressed by the latter to the premier during yesterday's session of the Unterhaus. Badeni was wounded in the right hand. Dr. Wolff fought a duel with swords on May 8 last with Herr Horica, a Czech member of the Unterhaus. This encounter grew out of the violent scenes which occurred in the house between the Germans and Czechs, in which personalities were freely in-

dulged in. Count Badeni was formerly governor of Galicia. He is a young and able Pole, and was very little known, even n Austria, until he was unexpectedly called on to form a cabinet in September, 1895, when he assumed the duties of president of the council of min-Count Badeni's wound is not serious The bullet entered the wrist and went out above the elbow.

CRUEL "FUN."

How a Hamilton Boy Had Both His Arms Broken, Hamilton, Sept. 25 .- While playing with some boys at the Hamilton crickt club grounds Thursday John Neville, a 9-year-old lad, got his arms broken. He was pulled up with a rope over a horizontal bar by his companions, who allowed him to drop suddenly. The ambulance was called and the lad removed to the city hospital. His mother is very ill with a fever at present. Hs brother was kicked by a lad named Ballard about a

year ago, and is a cripple. CANADA'S WHEAT.

Makes the Best of Seed Grain in the Estimation of the Russian Government.

Winnipeg, Sept. 25 .- Prof. Saunders, director of Canadian experimental farms, who accompanied the British scientists on their trip to the Pacific coast, is now returning east, and en route is visiting the experimental farms in the west. He left yesterday o inspect the progress made at the oneer farm established by the Onario Government at Dryden. "As a esult of the visit of a commissioner of agriculture from Russia," said Prof. Saunders, "who inspected the country during the summer, the government of that power has ordered ten tons of choice seed grain from the Dominion experimental farms, to be shipped o Vladivostock, in Siberia, and to be distributed among farmers there, in the hope of improving the grade of wheat in that territory." While in the city Prof. Saunders negotiated with the C. P. R. authorities for the transportation of the grain, which will be lected from wheat grown on Indian Head and Brandon farms. At Branion farm the record of the yields for the season were per acre: Wheat. 23 o 401/2 bushels; oats, 39 to 78 bushels; barley, 36 to 46 bushels; peas, 36 to 4 bushels. At Indian Head-Wheat, 23 to 42 bushels; oats, 50 to 101 bushels; barley, 49 to 77 bushels; peas, 20 to 4 bushels.
