An Execution Postponed Because the

Rope Broke. COLUMBUS, Miss., Feb. 8 .- Wm. Purvis, young negro, was to have been hanged on Wednesday for an alleged murder. The S. Fraine, tailor, missed a lot of buttons. black cap was placed over the condemned man's head and the drop fell. Purvis, instead of being strangled, was thrown to the ground. The noose had parted, and Purvis' neck was only slightly abrased. He fell on his back and remained still for a few moments. A man rused forward, and bending over the negro asked "Are you hurt?" From under his black cap Purvis replied,

'For God's sake, get me out of this." Others came up and Sheriff Magee made ready to conduct Purvis back to the scaffold for a second attempt. There were four of the board of supervisors present, and they called the sheriff into the court house for a conference. Rev. Mr. Cilsey, of Columbia Methodist Church, made an impassioned plea to the spectators, and it was decided by a unanimous vote that the execution be postponed. The negro was to-day taken to Meridian and the facts telegraphed to Governor Stone.
