100 Persons Perish and Property Loss Is \$2,000,000.

EIGHT VILLAGES IN PATH

Devastation by Storm in Cabin Creek and Coal River Valleys.

Charleston, W. Va., Aug. 10.—Relief parties worked desperately today in an effort to make their way up the Cabin Creek and Coal River valleys, which for 20 miles southward from the Kanawha River were devastated yesterday by a cloudburst, which left in its wake a death toll estimated at more than 100 persons and a property loss of at least \$2,000,000. Because of the topography of the country, state authorities here expressed the belief that it would be several days before the full extent of the flood could be ascertained.

At least eight villages and mining settlements in the district were either wholly or partly destroyed, while many others felt the effects of the storm more or less. Those practically destroyed or badly damaged were Ronda, Adams, Dry Branch, Miami, Sharon, Dawes, Kayson and Eskdale. Word was anxiously awaited from the 300 passengers who were on board an excursion train when it was marooned near St. Albans. A report was received late last night saying the train had been abandoned when the water reached the floors of the railway coaches.

STATE CONFERENCE TO PLAN WAR ON PLAGUE

Washington, D. C., Aug. 10.—The public health service, aroused over the inability to check the infantile paratyphoid in New York, has called a meeting of state health authorities to be held here next Thursday, August 17. Plans will be developed to combat the spread of the disease. The health service also seeks the experience of those in the state who have dealt with infantile paratyphoid, and may be able to suggest some means of curbing the epidemic.

CANNOT MATCH GERMANS IN MATTER OF CRUELTY

ALLIES WOULD EASILY BE OUTDISTANCED IN REPRISALS, SAYS LANDSDOWNE

London, Aug. 10.—Replying in the House of Lords yesterday to the suggestion of Baron Bessborough that the Government, in reprisal for the execution of the British steamship Brussels, should confiscate all German property in this country and intern all Germans, the Marquess of Lansdowne, who was followed by the Marquess of Salisbury, said that the suggestion was a very different from one which had been heard, "that we should imitate the cruelty and persecutions which the Germans have resorted to, and would be unworthy of this country and would be easily outdistanced by our enemies."

As far as can be learned at present, the loss of life will not exceed twelve. Financial, Market and Commercial Section

THE LOCAL MARKET

The local market was a fairly large one this morning, fruit and vegetables being the chief offerings. Most of the produce was sold at a profit. Apples were slow at 60c to 80c a bushel. A few boxes of red and black raspberries were offered at 15c a box wholesale, and 15c a box retail. The market was fairly brisk. A few cherries were sold at \$1.15 and \$1.25 a basket. Blackberries were very plentiful and sold as low as a shilling a box. The highest price was 15c.

Vegetable prices as a whole remained steady. Green corn was cheaper, selling at 15c and 20c a dozen. Tomatoes sold at from 10c to 12½c a pound. Cucumbers were lower at 20c to 50c a dozen. A few loads of hay were brought in, the prices being slightly better, and the market brisker. Most of the loads brought from \$11 to \$14 a ton. Oats were scarce, selling at \$1.30 to \$1.38 a bushel. Wheat sold at 56c to \$1 a bushel. Live hogs remained steady at \$11.75, the highest price reached on the local market yet.

Dairy products remained steady, as well as poultry and eggs. Wholesale prices for eggs were slightly lower. Butchers' meats were scarce and steady and hides and skins were steady.

GRAIN.

Winnipeg, Aug. 9.—Wheat closed very strong, 12c higher for October and December and also for May. Oats were 1½c up for October, and 1½c higher for December. Barley was 2½c up for October, and 1½c up for December. The market made a record gain. Advance of 1½c in wheat made before, but 12c has everything beaten. From the time of the record, the market reached today was a spread of 14½c. There was an enormous trade in all points. The market was on the buying side at some part. Those who took their profits early were eager to get in again, and played for a soft spot. Exporters did a little business overnight. Outside orders were in, but not so plentiful as formerly.

The cash demand was fair to good for wheat and oats. Orders were offered liberally. Premiums were unchanged in both grains.
