### BIBLE SOCIETY ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the Watford branch of the Canadian Bible Society was held in Trinity church, on Thursday evening, October 7th, the president of the branch, Rev. T. DeCourcy Rayner, presiding. A large congregation assembled and each one of the resident ministers took part in the service.

The reports of the secretary and treasurer were presented and showed a year of good work. These splendid reports were unanimously adopted.

The speaker of the evening was the Rev. R. J. Bowen, District Secretary of the Bible Society. Mr. Bowen gave an intensely interesting address, in which he set forth the magnificent work record of the British and Foreign Bible Society, of which the Canadian Bible Society is a branch. The Society's agents were at work in twenty-five belligerent countries, giving freely copies of the Scriptures, New Testaments and Gospels to the soldiers of all nations, with the result that, while the Society closed its books last year with a small balance on the right side nevertheless the shelves in its many depots the world over are practically empty and increased financial support is absolutely necessary to replenish the stocks of Bibles, etc., and to maintain the good work that is being done under post-war conditions. Coincident with the great Forward Movement in the churches there must be a Forward Movement in support of the work of the Bible Society if the missionary program of the churches is to be carried out efficiently and effectively, because the missionaries of all the churches depend on the Bible Society to provide copies of the Scriptures in over six hundred different languages and dialects. Even in Canada copies of the Scriptures are needed in over one hundred and

twenty languages to meet the requirements of the "strangers within our gates."

A hearty vote of thanks to Mr. Bowen for his splendid address was carried unanimously. A vote of thanks to the collectors for their splendid work also carried unanimously.
