The Brig Argo, which sailed from hence on the 18th inst. for Belfast, when off Quoddy head encountered head winds and being late in the evening, made for the Passage, where she rode at anchor until next morning; a heavy gale then came on from the southward, and the tide causing a tremendous sea, one of her chain cables snapped, and the other was shipped in order to save the vessel from going ashore. She then bore for a harbour, but unfortunately grounded opposite Lunenburg. She has since been got off, returned to this port on the 24th, and is now undergoing the necessary repairs.
