

Mr. Sanders' newest copper dust of the same formula is about two cents lower in price than the original copper arsenic dust on account of coal being eliminated in the manufacture. After having devised two widely used spray materials and four widely used dusting materials he is of the opinion that his green copper dust formula was the biggest find possible.
