BOOK POST.

(From *The Old Countryman* March 12, 1855.)

We are authorised to state, on the 1st March the privileges of the Inland Book Post will be extended to the Colonial Book Post; and thus, except as regards the charge, the difference in the regulations of the two Book Posts (which has been a frequent source of error) will cease. Under the new regulation it will be allowable to send any number of separate publications in the same cover, to write marginal notes in the books, (except letters) and to forward any other manuscript that is open to inspection.

In order to provide for cases in which, from inadvertence, a book-packet may be insufficiently pre-paid, it has been ordered that after the first of March every such book-packet having affixed thereupon postage stamps equal to a single book rate, (generally 6d.) shall be charged, not as heretofore, with the letter rate, but only with the deficient book postage—plus an additional single book rate.

NOTE.—The above regulations have just been announced, and must be taken in lieu of those which appear in page 12.
