**CHEESE FACTORY**—We are pleased to learn that a cheese factory is about being established near the Mallory neighborhood in this Township. Mr. S. S. Howell, of that vicinity, has for some time past given this project his best attention, and his exertions are now, it appears, about to prove successful. Mr. N. B. Whitney, of Lewis county, N. Y., at the instance of Mr. Howell, is now here, and seeing that there is an excellent opportunity offered to establish the business of cheese making, in which he has had long experience, has determined to build a cheese factory, and go into business immediately. He calculates to expend \$2,000 out of his own pocket in putting up buildings and working material. A meeting will be held to-day in the residence on the "Hunter Farm," on the Grafton Road, at one o'clock, for the purpose of organizing a company to carry out the project. We are informed that Mr. Whitney will erect the factory, after which he will manufacture cheese for the company now forming at the rate of two cents per pound, the company, of course, to furnish the milk. We are glad to see that this branch of business is about being commenced in this vicinity, and have no doubt but that it will prove a remunerative and profitable enterprise. A better locality than that selected by Mr. Whitney, wherein to commence operations, does not exist in Canada.—*Cobourg Sentinel*.

**CUT NAILS**—Are in demand for Western account, and sales have been made to a considerable extent at our quotations.

**SHEEP GOODS**—A fair business has been done, but there is less demand than previously.

BUSINESS continues moderately quiet for this season of the year, though probably as many goods are being sold as at this time last year. There is an absence of all animation, and the demand is only for certain classes of staples, and a few fancy goods with which to assort stocks. The cold weather which has come on this week will, we think, stimulate the country trade in woollens, as well as the wholesale business here, which has been very sluggish for some time past. Orders are coming in rather more freely, but by no means equal to expectations.

BUSINESS the past week has been very quiet with few sales of consequence, and as the season is rapidly approaching when boot and shoe manufacturers enter upon stock taking, no large demand for leather is likely to take place for the present.

**SPANISH SOLE**—There is no change to report, a good demand still exists for light inferior stock.

**SLAUGHTER SOLE**—Some demand exists for slaughter, which is scarce, no large quantities however could be placed at present.

**HARNESS**—Receipts still limited and prices firm.

**WAXED UPPER**—Continues dull, with few or no sales to report, and concessions would hardly induce large sales.

**GRAINED UPPER**—Some sales have been effected the past week at lower figures.

**BUFF AND PENNEN**—There is less activity, and purchases are only made to supply immediate necessities.

**PATENT AND ENAMELLED**—Very quiet with few or no sales.

**CALFSKINS**—Exceedingly dull and difficult of sale.

**SPLITS**—Are less in demand, and stocks are accumulating to some extent.

**SHEEPSKINS**—Have been sold pretty freely at fair prices.

**HIDES**—The stock has somewhat increased, and prices though not quotably less are less firm.

NOW that the trade sales are about over, there is more activity noticeable in the regular trade of the city, and a more settled feeling exists than for the past five or six weeks. Still, however, the volume of business is limited, and no large lots of any consequence have changed hands.

**TEAR**—Since the sale last Saturday, of Messrs. D. Torrance & Co (particulars of which will be found below) there has been but little business transacted except in Twa-kays. For these there is a good demand, strengthened by the scarcity of medium grades, and prices are firm, with, if anything, an upward tendency. In Blacks there is nothing doing, but we think present prices will remain unchanged for some time.

**COFFEE**—Is inactive and unchanged in price. The stock is fully adequate to the wants of the trade for some time to come, but holders are not pressing sales.

**SUGAR**—Is in good demand at previous rates, especially bright Barbadoes, which moves off readily at from \$3 3/4 to \$3 62. Porto Rico and Cuba sugars are also well enquired for and full rates maintained.

**MOLASSES**—Meets with somewhat more enquiry, owing, doubtless, to the weather having become colder.
