

A.4. Telephone and Related Services

During 1991, the Company's revenues from operations derived from basic telephone services which are subject to tariff regulation (approximately 77%), and from other services not currently subject to tariff regulation (approximately 23%). Revenues derived from basic telephone services include charges for local service (approximately 49% of revenues from operations for 1991), domestic long distance service (approximately 22% of such revenues, recognizing all revenues generated by the subscribers utilizing this service pursuant to a new tariff structure), and international long distance service for approximately 6% of such revenues.
