ARTICLE 5

 \cdot (1) No aircraft carrier shall exceed 23,000 tons (23,368 metric to standard displacement or carry a gun with a calibre exceeding $6 \cdot 1$ in. (155 m^D)

(2) If the armament of any aircraft carrier includes guns exceeding $5 \cdot 2^{5}$ (134 mm.) in calibre, the total number of guns carried which exceed that call shall not be more than ten.

ARTICLE 6

(1) No light surface vessel of sub-category (b) exceeding 8,000 tons $\binom{8}{2}$ metric tons) standard displacement, and no light surface vessel of sub-categories (a) shall be laid down or acquired prior to the 1st January, 1943.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) above, if the requirements of the national security of any High Contracting Party are, in His opinion materially affected by the actual or authorized amount of construction by a Power of light surface vessels of sub-category (b), or of light surface vessels conforming to the restrictions of paragraph (1) above, such High Contractive Party shall, upon notifying the other High Contracting Parties of His intention and the reasons therefor, have the right to lay down or acquire light surface vessels of sub-categories (a) and (b) of any standard displacement up to 100 tons (10,610 metric tons) subject to the observance of the provisions of Partion of the present Treaty. Each of the other High Contracting Parties subthereupon be entitled to exercise the same right.

(3) It is understood that the provisions of paragraph (1) above constitution on undertaking expressed or implied to continue the restrictions therein prescription after the year 1942.

ARTICLE 7

No submarine shall exceed 2,000 tons (2,032 metric tons) standard displate ment or carry a gun exceeding 5.1 in. (130 mm.) in calibre.

ARTICLE 8

Every vessel shall be rated at its standard displacement, as defined Article 1A of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE 9

No preparations shall be made in merchant ships in time of peace for installation of warlike armaments for the purpose of converting such ships vessels of war, other than the necessary stiffening of decks for the mountine guns not exceeding $6 \cdot 1$ in. (155 mm.) in calibre.

ARTICLE 10

Vessels which were laid down before the date of the coming into force of present Treaty, the standard displacement or armament of which exceeds limitations or restrictions prescribed in this Part of the present Treaty for b category or sub-category, or vessels which before that date were converted target use exclusively or retained exclusively for experimental or training poses under the provisions of previous treaties, shall retain the category designation which applied to them before the said date.
