

Customs tariff—326c. Concave blanks of uncoloured clear glass, when imported by manufacturers to be used exclusively in the manufacture of silvered mirror reflectors for lighting systems: British preferential tariff, free; intermediate tariff, 10 per cent; general tariff, 10 per cent.

Mr. RHODES: I have an amendment to move to this item, that it be amended to read as follows:

Blanks of uncoloured clear glass, when imported by manufacturers to be used exclusively in the manufacture of silvered mirror reflectors or acid etched reflectors or refractors, for lighting systems: British preferential tariff, free; intermediate tariff, 10 per cent; general tariff, 10 per cent.

Mr. STEWART (Edmonton): That is a new item.

Mr. RHODES: It was a budget item but it is now widened.

Mr. MATTHEWS: I move accordingly.

Mr. EULER: Will the minister say whether these are manufactured in this country?

Mr. RHODES: They are not.

Amendment agreed to.

Item as amended agreed to.

Customs tariff—326d. Beads, drops or other shapes of glass, when imported by manufacturers of imitation pearls, for use exclusively in the manufacture of such articles in their own factories: British preferential tariff, free; intermediate tariff, free; general tariff, free.

Item agreed to.

Customs tariff—334. Kryolite or cryolite: British preferential tariff, free; intermediate tariff, free; general tariff, free.

Item agreed to.

Customs tariff—339a. Lead capsules for bottles: British preferential tariff, free; intermediate tariff, 27½ per cent; general tariff, 30 per cent.

Item agreed to.

Customs tariff—353. Aluminium and alloys thereof, crude or semi-fabricated, viz.: Pigs, ingots, blocks, notch bars, slabs, billets and blooms; bars, rods and wire; angles, channels, beams, tees and other rolled or drawn sections and shapes; pipes and tubes; plates, sheets and strips, including circles; leaf, n.o.p., or foil, less than .005 inch in thickness, plain or embossed, with or without backing; wire and cable, twisted or stranded, reinforced with steel or not; aluminum powder: British preferential tariff, free; intermediate tariff, 30 per cent; general tariff, 30 per cent.

Mr. RALSTON: What is the change in this item?

Mr. RHODES: This change is merely to insert the letters "n.o.p." as a result of the item which follows.

Item agreed to.

Customs tariff—353a. Aluminum leaf, less than .005 millimetres in thickness; aluminum scrap. Provided, that nothing shall be deemed to be aluminum scrap except waste or refuse aluminum, fit only to be remelted: British preferential tariff, free; intermediate tariff, free; general tariff, free.

Mr. RHODES: This item as at present in the tariff covers aluminum scrap free of duty and it is proposed herewith to widen it to cover aluminum leaf which is described in the item in technical language.

Item agreed to.

Customs tariff—362a. Metal parts, electroplated, for loose-leaf binders: British preferential tariff, 20 per cent; intermediate tariff, 37½ per cent; general tariff, 45 per cent.

Item agreed to.

Customs tariff—365a. Findings of metal, not plated or coated, including stampings, trimmings, spring-rings, bolt-rings, clasps, snaps, swivels, vest chain bars, joints, catches, pin tongues, buckle tongues, coil pins, clip actions, settings and eyepins, when imported by manufacturers of jewellery or ornaments for the adornment of the person, for use exclusively in the manufacture of such articles, in their own factories: British preferential tariff, 15 per cent; intermediate tariff, 25 per cent; general tariff, 30 per cent.

Mr. RHODES: This is a tariff board item.

Item agreed to.

Customs tariff—365b. Wire or strip, viz.: Gold, gold-filled, silver, silver-filled, brass or nickel silver, knurled, twisted, figured or with ornamental design rolled or drawn thereon, and wire of nickel silver, plain, in coil or otherwise, when imported by manufacturers of jewellery or ornaments for the adornment of the person, for use exclusively in the manufacture of such articles, in their own factories: British preferential tariff, free; intermediate tariff, 20 per cent; general tariff, 25 per cent.

Mr. RHODES: This is also a tariff board item.

Item agreed to.

Customs tariff—370. Copper rollers, and stones, used in the printing of textile fabrics or wallpaper: British preferential tariff, free; intermediate tariff, 10 per cent; general tariff, 10 per cent.

Item agreed to.

Customs tariff—375. Ferro-alloys:

(a) Ferro-manganese, spiegeleisen and other alloys of manganese and iron containing not more than 1 per centum, by weight, of silicon—per pound, or fraction thereof on the man-
