VIET NAM—REASON FOR WITHDRAWAL OF CANADIAN AIRCRAFT FROM AREA IN VIEW OF DESIRE OF SOME VIETNAMESE TO COME TO CANADA

Mr. Allan B. McKinnon (Victoria): Mr. Speaker, a few minutes ago the Acting Prime Minister stated he has provided selected lists of Vietnamese personnel to the Americans asking the United States to accept these people and divert them to us. If the Acting Prime Minister is to be taken seriously with regard to this plan, why was one of our two Hercules aircraft in Hong Kong withdrawn from that area today?

Hon. Mitchell Sharp (Acting Prime Minister): Mr. Speaker, I do not think there is any contradiction between these two actions. It appears to us to be unlikely that there would be an opportunity to lift the Vietnamese who would be permitted to get to the airport or, alternatively, if the regime had collapsed and there were general chaos of course the airport would be unusable. I believe it was very prudent for us to have done what we could on behalf of these Vietnamese who might be able to get out one way or another by methods that we could not choose because we do not have armed forces to support our particular views in Viet Nam whereas the Americans do, potentially if not actually. So, I do not think there is any contradiction.

- 2. Have any lands for right-of-way been acquired by the National Capital Commission or any other agency or department for the purposes contemplated in Part 1?
 - 3. What was the cost of the lands acquired as contemplated in Part 2?
- 4. Has any provision been made in the Estimates for 1975-1976 for the acquisition of lands required for right-of-way as set forth in Part 1 by any of the agencies or departments mentioned in Part 2?
- 5. Have any tenders been called for the construction of any part of the work contemplated in Part 1?

Hon. Barney Danson (Minister of State for Urban Affairs): In so far as the National Capital Commission is concerned: 1. (a), (b), (c) and (d)—Planning by the regional municipality of Ottawa-Carleton suggests that some of the rights-of-way acquired by the National Capital Commission for parkway purposes be used for arterial roads forming part of the regional road network. Without prejudice to the purposes for which these rights-of-way were acquired, NCC planning for the construction of parkways beyond those which already exist, or are currently under construction, is temporarily being held in abeyance pending consideration of proposals by the regional municipality of Ottawa-Carleton. No dates on which construction will commence have been established.
