DEFENCE CONSTRUCTION (1951) LTD.

Question No. 1,561—Mr. Howie:

What are the guidelines employed by Defence Construction (1951) Ltd. to determine whether contracts for the construction of buildings, roads, repairs to buildings and renovations will be called (a) by advertisement in newspapers (b) by invitation only (c) without tender?

Mrs. Ursula Appolloni (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of National Defence): Defence Construction (1951) Ltd. is subject to the provisions of the government contracts regulations issued pursuant to the Financial Administration Act and, accordingly, the following guidelines with respect to the calling of tenders reflect these provisions:

- With few exceptions, tenders are called by advertising in trade papers and newspapers.
- Tenders would be invited only in a case where the scope or complexity of the work requires a particular degree of expertise or experience. In such a case, the require-

ment would be advertised in trade papers and newspapers and firms would be invited to submit their credentials for prequalification. Only suitably qualified firms would be invited to tender.

- Tenders would not be called where the need is one of pressing emergency in which delay would be injurious to the public interest or in the rare case where only one firm is capable of performing the contract.
