I have spoken to our District Plant Superintendent with regard to the man referred to in your letter of the 21st instant, and it is possible that he may be able to place him, at least temporarily for the May Move.

I am thoroughly in sympathy with your sentiments with regard to our returned men. We kept the jobs for some 800 of our men who went Overseas, and most of them have been re-established with us, but owing to our inability to extend, for reasons with which you are doubtless familiar, we have not been in a position to engage extra help of any kind. In fact during the last few months we have had to do considerable retrenching.

However, if you will kindly send the man referred to to Mr. George E. Higgins, 207 Mountain Street, I have no doubt he will give him a job for the time being.
