Rock-efeller, with the accompanying expla-nation by the British ambassador, Sir Cecil Spring-Rice, that the vessel was detained only because of doubt as to the destination of her cargo, was con-strued as an admission by the British Government of the right of vessels properly under American registry, to carry oil without molestation between neutral ports. 
