THE WEATHER

OBSERVATORY, Toronto, Dec. 16.—(E

p.m.)—The pressure continues very low

in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, but over the

greatest portion of the continent it is

abnormally high. Gales are still blowing

from the great lakes to Newfoundland,

accompanied by light local snow and de-

cidedly cold weather.
