PHYSIOLOGY OF RESPIRATION.



OTTAWA. Feb. 19.—Hon. C. J. Botherty has given notice of a bill to amend the independence of parliament act in opder to prevent the disqualitication of members or senators by reason of absence with overseas expeditionary forces and their receiving pay for these services.

There is no reference in the amendment to such a contingency as a reneral election while members of parliament are serving their country during a war. It is unnecessary. Candidates can be nominated and elected in their absence, and special legislation can be passed to meet the case of a member being elected in absence and not taking his scat for sometime after the election.

It is quite usual for the house to pass special legislation to enable members who have been absent thru illness or other cause to draw their indemnities.
