- 2. For alterations in the present building, to make apartments now occupied by the Principal into dormitories to accommodate more pupils.
- 3. For repairs on the present building and additional rooms for the teaching staff.

REMOVAL OF DEFICITS, \$60,000

The increasing cost of exchange and operation has resulted in a deficit of nearly \$50,000 in the Foreign Mission Fund. Owing to heavier demands on their resources, the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Fund and the Pointe-aux-Trembles Schools also showed deficits in 1918. For the removal of these \$60,000 is set down in the special offering.

TO ASSURE ADEQUATE CURRENT REVENUE, \$100,000

\$100,000 is to be set apart for current revenue, to help assure adequate maintenance of the work during the next two years. At the same time it is earnestly hoped that every session and congregation will see to it that during the special effort the Annual Budget is generously maintained and advanced.

The \$4,000,000 apportioned as above, represents the share of the Presbyterian Church in the Great National Thank Offering of \$12,000,000 to be presented by the five co-operating communions (viz. Anglican, Baptist, Congregational, Methodist and Presbyterian) during the second week in February, 1920.
