Montreal, May 8.—(Special.)—The recent mission of Dr. Torrey in Montreal was successful, judging from the results officially announced to-night. It is announced that the revival invitation to accept Christianity brought response from 2372 persons. The services were held in St. Method's church, the largest number of responses were from Presbyterians (430), with the Methodists second (745), the Church of England third (265), and the others divided—Baptists 165, Congregationalists 80, Roman Catholics 25, Brethren 16, Salvation Army 9, Lutherans 6, Jews 4, Christian Scientists 5, Reformed Episcopalians 3, and non-denominational 59.
