Grain rates from New York to Liverpool have advanced from 1%d to 4%d, and proportionately to other English and Continental points. Rates from Chicago to Liverpool, that were 11½c per bushel five weeks ago, are now 17.58c per bushel.

The English commercial papers seem to confirm scarcity of wheat in the United Kingdom and their dependence on America for their replenishment. The stocks now held by Great Britain are more than 35,000 bushels less than at this time a year ago, nearly 33,000,000 bushels less than in 1894, and over 46,000,000 bushels smaller than in 1898, and with Russia, India and Argentine at nearly the point of exhaustion it is easily seen why the English buyers are turning, attention to America. It is not unlikely that a continuance of the advance on this side may cause a temporary halt in the foreign demand, but if prices are held within reason they will undoubtedly be met; it is a long time before another crop will be available, and in the meantime the empty bins must be replenished, and largely, it would appear, from America's surplus.


