The inferior grades of wheat are practically exhausted, and home millers are obliged to buy contract grades, the stocks of which, too, at the present rate of depletion, will soon be infinitesimal.

It is all a question of supply and demand, said he. We hold the supply; the demand comes from every wheat-buying country and keeps on coming.

If not from us from whom can they obtain their supply?

Not being prepared to answer this conundrum off-hand I decided to take it into my serious consideration, a course I most cheerfully commend to those who feel that wheat at present is too high in price.


